Behind the DOORYARD label are small-batch ciders, formerly sold only up here on the Hill.

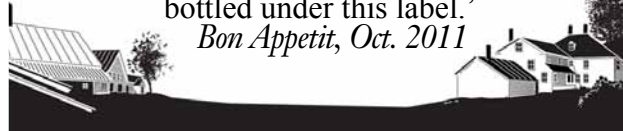
**All 'Dooryard' is 7.5% alcohol.**
